UPDATES ON THE CAVALRY'S ADVOCACY



This week IAVA continued to work with congressional offices to secure advocacy meetings for the newest Cavalry cohort. Three congressional meetings took place this week, including two Cavalry meetings with Rep. Steil and Sen. Budd's staff. Additionally, IAVA's policy team met with Sen. Shaheen's staff to discuss an issue with the Excess Leave Program (ELP) which is utilized by active-duty Marines attending Law School. IAVA policy staff has also been hard at work reviewing proposed legislation for endorsement. The most pressing legislation currently under review is regarding the budget deficit reported by the VA for FY24 and FY25 which has the potential to negatively impact compensation and benefits.
